About ICIMOD

The Hindu Kush Himalaya (HKH) region stretches 3,500km across Asia, spanning eight countries – Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, China, India, Myanmar, Nepal, and Pakistan. Encompassing high-altitude mountain ranges, mid-hills, and plains, the zone is vital for the food, water, and energy security of up to two billion people and is a habitat for countless irreplaceable species. It is also acutely fragile – and frontline to the impacts of the triple planetary crisis of climate change, pollution, and biodiversity loss.

The International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD), based in Kathmandu, Nepal, is an international organisation established in 1983, that is working to make this critical region greener, more inclusive and climate resilient. The South Asian Network for Development and Environmental Economics (SANDEE), a research capacity and academic leadership development programme at the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD), supports research in South Asia and Hindu Kush Himalaya (HKH) region on the interconnection between environmental and development issues.

Position overview

In celebration of its 25 years of service to the region, SANDEE is organizing the **International Conference on Development and Environmental Economics: SANDEE@25** to be held in Kathmandu, Nepal, from 12-14 December 2025. This event celebrates SANDEE's efforts at strengthening environmental economics education and research capacity, facilitating regional collaboration, and generating evidence for informed policy making across South Asia and the Hindu Kush Himalaya.

The conference will bring together researchers, practitioners, policy makers, and friends of SANDEE to reflect on past learnings and explore alternatives for addressing the challenges of tomorrow. It will feature keynote addresses by prominent speakers, panel discussions, research presentations, and policy dialogues centred around the conference themes: Development, Environment, and Mountains. The intern will support in communications aspects of SANDEE, with major contribution to the SANDEE@25 event.

Responsibilities

The intern will assist the SANDEE and ICIMOD communications teams in preparing, curating, and promoting content and materials related to the SANDEE@25 event.

- The specific tasks include, but not limited to:
- Extracting relevant photos from the SANDEE's archive for the photo story presentation at SANDEE@25 conference.
- Extracting relevant materials from SANDEE's information archive, to produce relevant communication materials.
- Support preparation of pre, during, and post event reports and communications outputs. These include but not limited to writing captions for social media, drafting press releases or articles, develop contents for web, gathering information for drafting speaking notes, rapporteur work, photo and video capturing, interview facilitation, note-taking, among others.
- Support in other communications-related tasks as per requirement.
- Provide other support as the need.

- Experience of working in digital / communications space.

Reporting and supervising

The Intern will report to the Senior Communications Officer, Regional Action and Global Advocacy. The Intern will also work in close collaboration with Senior Programme Coordinator, SANDEE and other staff, where relevant.

Location

You will be working in a cross-cultural, impact-oriented environment at ICIMOD's head office in Kathmandu, Nepal.

Kathmandu is a lively and exciting place to live. People are friendly, living costs are comparatively inexpensive, food is delicious (with a range of local and international cuisines), and there are good local and international schools and a low crime rate. Duration

This is a fixed term internship, and the intern will be serving until end of December 2025 without further extension.

Remuneration/Stipend

A monthly stipend of NPR 20,000 – 30,000 will be provided depending on the qualification and experience. This is not an employment position at ICIMOD; hence the Intern will not be entitled to staff salary and benefits.
